Child Safety and Protection Policy at Blackstrap Youth Camp

1. Introduction:

1.1 Blackstrap Youth Camp is dedicated to providing a safe and secure environment for children and workers. This policy outlines our commitment to child safety and protection, establishing procedures to safeguard the well-being of all camp participants.

2. Scope:

- 2.1 This policy applies to all staff members, volunteers, contractors, and anyone involved in activities or programs at Blackstrap Youth Camp.
- 2.2 It encompasses measures for preventing, identifying, and responding to potential risks to children's safety and well-being.

3. Child Protection Principles:

- 3.1 Blackstrap Youth Camp adheres to the following principles to ensure the safety and protection of children:
 - a) Zero tolerance for any form of abuse, neglect, exploitation, or harm against children.
 - b) Respect for children's rights, dignity, and individuality.
 - c) Promotion of open communication and transparency in all interactions with children.

4. Screening and Selection of Personnel:

- 4.1 All staff members must undergo thorough background checks, including criminal record checks and reference verifications, before being permitted to work with children.
- 4.2 Training on child protection policies, procedures, and mandatory reporting requirements shall be provided to all personnel prior to their engagement with children.

5. Supervision and Monitoring:

- 5.1 Adequate supervision shall be maintained at all times to ensure the safety of children participating in camp activities.
- 5.2 Staff-to-child ratios shall adhere to established guidelines to facilitate effective supervision and monitoring.
- 5.3 Regular checks and inspections of facilities and equipment shall be conducted to identify and address potential safety hazards.

6. Reporting and Response Procedures:

- 6.1 Any concerns or suspicions regarding child safety or well-being must be reported immediately to the Executive Camp Director.
- 6.2 Reports of alleged or suspected abuse, neglect, or other safety concerns shall be taken seriously and investigated promptly and impartially according to provincial and federal guidelines.
- 6.3 Confidentiality shall be maintained throughout the reporting and investigation process, with information disclosed only to authorized personnel and relevant authorities as required by law.

7. Training and Awareness:

7.1 Ongoing training and professional development opportunities shall be provided to staff members to enhance their understanding of child protection issues and their capacity to respond effectively.

8. Code of Conduct:

- 8.1 A code of conduct outlining expected behaviours and standards of interaction with children shall be established for all personnel.
- 8.2 Any breaches of the code of conduct shall be addressed promptly and may result in disciplinary action, up to and including termination of employment or engagement.

9. Documentation and Record-Keeping:

- 9.1 Accurate and comprehensive records shall be maintained regarding incidents, complaints, investigations, and actions taken in relation to child safety and protection.
- 9.2 Records shall be stored securely and in compliance with applicable privacy laws and regulations.

10. Review and Revision:

- 10.1 This policy shall be reviewed annually to ensure its effectiveness and compliance with evolving legal requirements and best practices in child protection.
- 10.2 Any revisions to the policy shall be communicated to all personnel and stakeholders and implemented promptly.

11. Compliance:

11.1 Failure to comply with this policy may result in disciplinary action, legal consequences, and/or exclusion from participation in camp activities, as per applicable laws and regulations.

12. Implementation:

12.1 This policy shall be implemented immediately upon approval by the SYDC, and communicated to all staff members, volunteers, contractors, parents/guardians, and relevant stakeholders of Blackstrap Youth Camp.

This policy underscores Blackstrap Youth Camp's unwavering commitment to prioritizing child safety and protection, establishing robust measures to mitigate risks and ensuring a nurturing environment for all camp participants.
